Town and Gown

2023/2024 Plans

- Based on what we have heard from community members, ASH hopes to diversify the T&G agenda including to discuss several issues related to housing that are linked to the university
- ASH will continue to monitor known issues related to excessive partying and disturbances associated with Panda, St. Patrick's Day and other major events

Activities in the past year

Project Reviews

New Provincial Planning Legislation

- The committee has a base understanding of the impacts on planning and heritage; however, implementing the new rules by the City will define the actual impact on Sandy Hill.
- The City has until the end of the year to implement the new changes.

Outreach to developers and organizations that have an impact on Sandy Hill

Strategically proactively engaging with developers and organizations like uOttawa and St.Alban's.

New City Zoning By-Laws

The City has launched a project to update the zoning by-laws to meet the requirements of the new City Official Plan. In addition, the committee is actively reviewing reports, recommendations and will be providing input.



Transportation Committee

2022 Changes in Sandy Hill

- Laurier/Nicholas rebuilt as a protected intersection
- New pedestrian crossing at Laurier/Range
- 4 intersections changed to 4-way stops (3 along Stewart + Cumberland / Daly
- New cycling track along Waller (Nicholas to Mackenzie-King bridge)
- Crosswalks rebuilt on Laurier at Chapel and at Nelson
- Start of project to rebuild Greenfield, adding cycling tracks in both directions
